DESTINATION JOY by Alberita Johnson, CL Minister



2024 has become yesterday, and we have arrived in 2025 whether we like it or not.

On February 3 I turn 65 and Medicare eligible, it's hard to believe.

Uncertainty looms before me, the heavy burden of its impact upon me, as I struggle to shake free. The weight of life is hard sometimes. How can we cope?

First find out why. I believe it is the election, January 6, January 20, and the subsequent executive orders. Suddenly I felt it strongly. The weight of it all. How can we cope?

Last month I shared about the safety of sanctuary. A sanctuary not of brick and mortar, but of tender loving care, given and received in Beloved Community, we call it All Faiths Unitarian Congregation.

January 20 was the inauguration of the President but more importantly it was Martin Luther King Jr. Day. Several of us marched and attended events at the park downtown. Some of us hosted our vendor table. Our Racial Equity Team members support the MLK Day events annually. This year was a joyful yet subdued event. Perhaps they too were burdened as so many are.

But there is something to celebrate right here at All Faiths. The All Faiths Beloved Community is growing. Our Sanctuary of hope, safety and peace is enlarging! Saturday, January 19 we hosted All Faiths New Member Orientation and nine new members were in attendance. January 26 is the New Members Ceremony, and February 16 we celebrate Founders' Day!

But mostly we celebrate each other and the loving sweet spirit that resides at All Faiths.

Every Sunday, we hear these words which is not only for visitors they are all of us:

Here you will find a diverse and inclusive spiritual commu-

nity, where we welcome people with many beliefs.

You can bring your whole self, your full identity, your questioning mind, and expansive heart.

January saw a small crew work on a Habitat for Humanity home. Five who intended to help were sidelined with illness or unexpected family responsibilities. We will do this again next January.

The documentary *Razing Liberty Square* was shown at All Faiths on January 24. Thanks to our outreach efforts, 36 people attended many from other LIFE congregations. Unfortunately, Paul Leingang from Fort Myers Housing Authority became ill and couldn't attend. Audience members from LIFE congregations, and the Collaboratory reminded us of the need for citizen engagement with the city over development decisions. We are encouraged to attend the March 3 City Council meeting which is scheduled to discuss housing.

We used money from this team to purchase 190 pairs of gloves and hats and 30 sets of hand warmers that were given to Matt Wallace's outreach team. They were distributed to people living on the street; especially needed during this unusually cold weather.

The bicycle collection continues thanks to Brian Bigelow who transports them to North Shore Alliance Church for repair and distribution to people experiencing homelessness. We have collected close to 280 bikes since starting this project.

As announced Sunday, January 19, after five years as chair and two as secretary of this team, I will be stepping down. We hope someone who has an interest will step up to lead the team. Without a new leader, the Heart for Homeless Team will disband on March 31, 2025.

Revenue/Operating Income and Expenses:

As we entered the 2024-2025 fiscal year on April 1, 2024, All Faiths budgeted \$200,200 for pledge giving; to date, actual pledges have totaled \$185,160 (92.5%). This current fiscal year ends on March 31, 2025.

No unusual expenses incurred in the General Fund Operating Account during December.

The Board approved the consolidation of several accounts to streamline accounting and to further increase interest income. These changes were made before the end of March 2024 and are reflected in the figures listed above. December's Interest Income was \$405.

At the beginning of the 2023-2024 fiscal year, several new accounts were created at Live Oak to generate increased interest income. The 1-Year CD rate is 5.0%. And the Savings rate is currently at 3.7%.

The December monthly transfer/deposit of \$1,530 to the Live Oak Capital Reserve account was made. No Capital Reserve expenses were incurred. However, planning is underway to repair the fence on the west side of the property and to replace the sign; both were damaged during Hurricane Milton.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

We are well on our way to meeting our goal. Have you turned in your 2025/2026 pledge form? The deadline is February 8. You can fill out a pledge form, which you should have received at service, online, or via U.S. Postal Service, or you can call your pledge in to the office at 239-226-0900.

As of January 28, we are at \$145,528 of our pledge goal of \$202,068. Your pledges directly impact All Faiths' budget for the upcoming fiscal year. All Faiths' goal budget is \$237,488. We rely on a comittment of \$202,068 in pledges; the balance of the funds are raised through rental income, fundraisers and other subsidized expenses.

Your donations pay for All Faiths' day-to-day expenses: staff salaries, benefits, workers comp., whorship services, wind, flood and liability insurance, utilities, lawncare, building maintenance and janitorial supplies.

We are grateful for your continuing support of All Faiths. We could not exist without your generosity. Thank you.

2023/24 FINANCIAL REVIEW

A review for the fiscal year (April 2023 - March 2024) for All Faiths Unitarian Congregation is complete. The financial systems, processes and documentation were reviewed by the team and found to be accurate and well-managed. The Congregational Administrator, Finance Committee, and Treasurer work well as a team to ensure that the congregational finances are well-managed with complete and accurate record keeping. Financial processes were found to be appropriate and well-documented. Both Regina Kilmartin and John Conrad are commended for their willingness and professionalism in providing all records and answering all questions throughout the review.

The review included: Cash receipts and bank deposits processes; proper authorization and processes for expenditures; bank statements; payroll procedures; invoice filing systems; budgetary controls; year-end income statement and balance sheet.

The only unusual financial change is the transfer of our financial accounts to Liveoak Bank. The transfer is a positive move because the move brought higher interest return to All Faiths.

BLACK history MONTH

Every February, people in the United States celebrate the achievements and history of African Americans as part of Black History Month.

Black History Month was created to focus attention on the contributions of African Americans to the United States. It honors all Black people from all periods of U.S. history, from the enslaved people first brought over from Africa in the early 17th century to African

Americans living in the United States today.

Among the notable figures often spotlighted during Black History Month are Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who fought for equal rights for Blacks during the 1950s and '60s; Thurgood Marshall, the first African-American justice appointed to the United States Supreme Court in 1967; Mae Jemison, who became the first female African-American astronaut to travel to space in 1992; and Barack Obama, who was elected the first-ever African-American president of the United States in 2008.

Since the first Negro History Week in 1926, other countries have joined the United States in celebrating Black people and their contribution to history and culture, including Canada, the United Kingdom, Germany, and the Netherlands.

Today Black History Month continues the discussion of Black people and their contributions through activities such as museum exhibits and film screenings, and by encouraging the study of achievements by African Americans year-round.


